THE IOURNEY





After returning from Quebec last fall, we were shocked to discover that the elder board members and several key families had left the country. As we began the process of rebuilding the congregation, gangs started to seize control of the city, causing several neighborhoods to become unsafe and prompting residents to flee to more secure areas. Faced with the decision to either leave or persevere in our efforts to rebuild, we chose to stay. The church has since transformed into a sanctuary for displaced individuals, with a 17-year-old girl accepting the Lord and a 19-year-old boy rededicating his life to Christ amidst the uncertainties and challenges we faced.



THE JOURNEY

Teaching about the Lord's supper in February was a transformative experience for our community. Witnessing believers who had not partaken in communion for many years joyfully participating was a powerful moment of liberation. It became clear to us that newcomers to our church needed a solid foundation in the basics of Christian life. This realization ignited a deep sense of responsibility to impart the teachings of the Word of God to them, guiding them on their spiritual journey and nurturing their faith. During that period, the pressure from family and friends compelled us to reassess our decision to remain. After much prayer and deliberation, we chose to stay, while closely monitoring the situation.

In March, following a prison break where criminals were freed by gangs, the gangs started to exert control over the airport, increasing the pressure for us to leave the country. Amidst this turmoil, we

found solace in the support of individuals who stayed

overnight at the church, assisting in preparations for Sunday morning services. It became evident that people were not just attending church for convenience, but rather to find hope.





GOOD FRIDAY





Good Friday at the village church was an amazing experience! Despite gang violence and overwhelming insecurity in the region, about 300 people gathered to celebrate this holy day.

The ceremony was marked by the baptism of a new believer, a moving moment that filled our hearts with joy and hope. Then we listened to the reading of the Easter story, a powerful reminder of Jesus' resurrection and victory over sin and death.

The songs and praises resounded in the church, creating an atmosphere of peace and gratitude. Despite the challenges and dangers that surround us, we have found comfort and strength in our faith.

Good Friday at The Village Church will be remembered as a time of communion, unity and courage. We were grateful to be able to celebrate together, despite the difficult circumstances. May this holy day remind us of the love and grace of God and inspire us to live in faith and hope.
